The Example of Jesus – Part Three

We have noticed the fact that while Jesus existed in the form of God He was willing to empty Himself and take the form of a servant. As a servant He was willing to endure the death on the cross. This was a death filled with great physical torture but there was also the shame for it was a death reserved for the worst of criminals. The writer of Hebrews tells us that Jesus “**endured the cross, despising the shame**” (Heb. 12:2). In addition to the physical torture and shame there was also the spiritual burden. Jesus was taking upon Himself the sins of the world and it was owing to this burden that Jesus was for the first and only time in all eternity separated from His Father. “**My God, my God, why hast thou forsaken me?**” (Mt. 27:46).

Because Jesus was willing to do this He was greatly rewarded by His Father. Paul tells us in **Philippians 2:9-11**, “**Wherefore God also hath highly exalted him, and given him a name which is above every name: 10 That at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, of things in heaven, and things in earth, and things under the earth; 11 And that every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.**” Jesus had taught His disciples that “**whosoever humbles himself, shall be exalted**” (Matt. 23:12), now God has “**highly exalted him**” as Paul said in **Ephesians 1:21**, “**Far above all principality, and power, and might, and dominion, and every name that is named, not only in this world, but also in that which is to come.**” God gave to Jesus a name that is above every name! Names suggest things to us. The names Bill Gates and Warren Buffett suggest the idea of wealth! George Patton perhaps suggest the idea of war! The name Judas surely suggests betrayal! But the name Jesus suggests “salvation!” Matthew writes of the appearance of an angel of the Lord to Joseph telling him, “**do not be afraid to take to you Mary your wife, for that which is conceived in her is of the Holy Spirit. 21 And she will bring forth a Son, and you shall call His name JESUS, for He will save His people from their sins**” (Matt. 1:21).

That name is a precious name. Peter said, “**unto you who believe, He is precious**” (1 Pet. 2:7). The name “Jesus: suggests comfort. “**Let not your hearts be troubled; you believe in God believe also in me** (John 14:1-6). His name also suggests a conquering. In **Rev. 6:1** John saw a rider on a white horse who was given a crown and a bow who then went forth, “**conquering and to conquer.**” In **Rev. 19:11-16** we learn that the rider is Jesus, and that now He has “**many crowns.**” So great is His name that at the mere mention of His name in judgment, “**every knee should bow, of things in heaven, and things in earth, and things under the earth; 11 And that every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.**”

Jesus humbled Himself to obey His Father and for that He was rewarded. God has a reward for all mankind, but to receive that reward we must all humble ourselves and obey God's will for us.
