What's On Your Plate?

Every holiday season we fill our plates to the brim with our favorite fatty dishes and desserts. And like clockwork, at the turn of the new year, many of us solemnly resolve to consider more carefully what we will put on our plates. Aspiring to eat healthier is always admirable, and certainly worth the effort. But as God's Word teaches us, food – healthy or unhealthy – does nothing to improve us spiritually (1 Cor. 8:8). As many of us resolve to fill our plates with healthier foods, we should also consider this: When it comes to our lives, what are we going to put on our plate this year?

We all have obligations concerning family, work, weekly chores, etc. And all these are services to the Lord Himself if we do them honorably and in His name (Col. 3:23-24). But what else will you put on your plate? The new year often begins with nothing on the horizon – like an empty plate. But before you know it, your plate can be overflowing with extracurriculars and optional activities that leave little room for personal spiritual growth and serving the Lord. And while leaving room for fun activities, down time, or rest is good and healthy for us, we can easily allow it to dominate the room in our schedule that we must be using for the Lord and for our own spiritual welfare.

As we begin to fill our plates this year, we must remember that we cannot live spiritually without regularly feeding on God's Word (1 Pet. 2:2; Mat. 4:4). Mary took time to listen at Jesus' feet to His Word (Lk. 10:39). And Jesus praised her for this (Lk. 10:41-42). Will you take time to prioritize Jesus' Word in your busy schedule this year? We also need to leave room on our plates to serve God's people and others (Gal. 6:9-10). If we as servants of Christ are too busy to serve – which is our primary function, then we desperately need to reprioritize what is on our plate. Anytime we go out of our way serve someone else, we allow our lights to shine, which gives us an opportunity to give glory to God and to evangelize for Christ (Mat. 5:14-16). We need to make time to encourage one another daily (Heb. 3:12-13). Life has many challenges, and we all need each other's encouragement to press on through challenges and difficulties. We need to make room for more time in prayer (Col. 4:2). Jesus' schedule was sometimes so busy that He didn't even have time to eat! (Mk. 3:20; 6:31) And even though He had a much more demanding schedule than we do, He still made time in prayer an essential priority (Lk. 5:16; Mk. 1:35).

God calls us to make the most of our limited time by spending it walking according to His will (Eph. 5:15-17). This requires us to lay aside anything that encumbers us from focusing on the things above (Heb. 12:1). So, this year, before we fill our schedules completely, let's commit to making time for being together, serving the Lord, and growing spiritually in our personal walk with the Lord.
