The Passing of the Year

To me, fall is one of the greatest times of the year. I enjoy the pumpkin spice everything, the occasional apple cider, or just sitting on the porch with a cup of coffee, watching the sunrise. Maybe it is the milder climate—a reprieve from our Southern summer—and the anticipation of the holiday season. But there is a whole lot more to fall than meets the eye.

Growing up, the go-to description of this beautiful season was Autumn. It comes from the Latin word autumnus, with the root meaning "the passing of the year."

Being reminded that the year is passing away was, at one time in our society, a warning—a caution to early settlers, an alert to those who worked the land: "You are running out of time to prepare for winter!" The harvest needed to be stored away for the immobility of the coming season.

Jesus was all too aware of the passing of the year. This is why He called laborers to work in His Kingdom:

"And Jesus went throughout all the cities and villages, teaching in their synagogues and proclaiming the gospel of the kingdom and healing every disease and every affliction. 36 When he saw the crowds, he had compassion for them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. 37 Then he said to his disciples, 'The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; 38 therefore pray earnestly to the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest'" (Matthew 9:35–38).

There are people in this world who are like sheep without a shepherd. For a shepherd, the coming of autumn means they must bring in the sheep from the mountains, where they have been free to roam all spring and summer.

"So he told them this parable: 4 'What man of you, having a hundred sheep, if he has lost one of them, does not leave the ninety-nine in the open country, and go after the one that is lost, until he finds it? 5 And when he has found it, he lays it on his shoulders, rejoicing. 6 And when he comes home, he calls together his friends and his neighbors, saying to them, "Rejoice with me, for I have found my sheep that was lost." 7 Just so, I tell you, there will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous persons who need no repentance" (Luke 15:3–7).

Jesus told this parable of the lost sheep:

Jesus told this parable of the lost sheep: ninety-nine had returned, but one was still out there. It was likely autumn, and the changing leaves may have served as a warning of the passing of the year. All the sheep needed to be safe in the fold. The shepherd must go and find the one who is missing.

"Look carefully then how you walk, not as unwise but as wise, 16 making the best use of the time, because the days are evil. 17 Therefore do not be foolish, but understand what the will of the Lord is" (Ephesians 5:15–17).
