God First, Family Second, and Country Third.

On Tuesday night, President Trump delivered the State of the Union Address. He covered a wide range of topics that helped us see where we have been as a country and where we are going.

George Washington delivered the first annual message in person to a joint session of Congress on January 8, 1790. In this address, he highlighted national priorities such as defense, foreign affairs, and education. For the 236 years since, it has been important for our nation to be aware of the focus of the federal government in this way, but what about a Christian? Should we be concerned about these things?

“Share in suffering as a good soldier of Christ Jesus. No soldier gets entangled in civilian pursuits, since his aim is to please the one who enlisted him” (2 Timothy 2:3-4).

Paul also told the Philippians, “But our citizenship is in heaven, and from it we await a Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ, who will transform our lowly body to be like his glorious body, by the power that enables him even to subject all things to himself” (Philippians 3:20-21).

So, with a citizenship in Heaven and enlistment from Jesus Himself, how are we to consider the state of the Union in which we live?

Jesus spoke with His father concerning the role of His children in this world and therefore within this union.

“I have given them your word, and the world has hated them because they are not of the world, just as I am not of the world. I do not ask that you take them out of the world, but that you keep them from the evil one” (John 17:14-15).

We are to be in the world but not of the world. But should a Christian be concerned with civilian pursuits?

Peter explains to his dispersed audience how one must conduct themselves in the world they live in. “Beloved, I urge you as sojourners and exiles to abstain from the passions of the flesh, which wage war against your soul. Keep your conduct among the Gentiles honorable, so that when they speak against you as evildoers, they may see your good deeds and glorify God on the day of visitation” (1 Peter 2:11-12).

Since our citizenship and recruiting officer are out of this world, we too are sojourners and exiles. Jeremiah gave the greatest advice concerning the exiles in Babylon, and it rings loud and clear for Christians in the United States of America.

“Seek the welfare of the city where I have sent you into exile, and pray to the Lord on its behalf; for in its welfare you will have welfare” (Jeremiah 29:7).

So, the state of the union is important for the welfare of all as we put God first, family second, and country third.

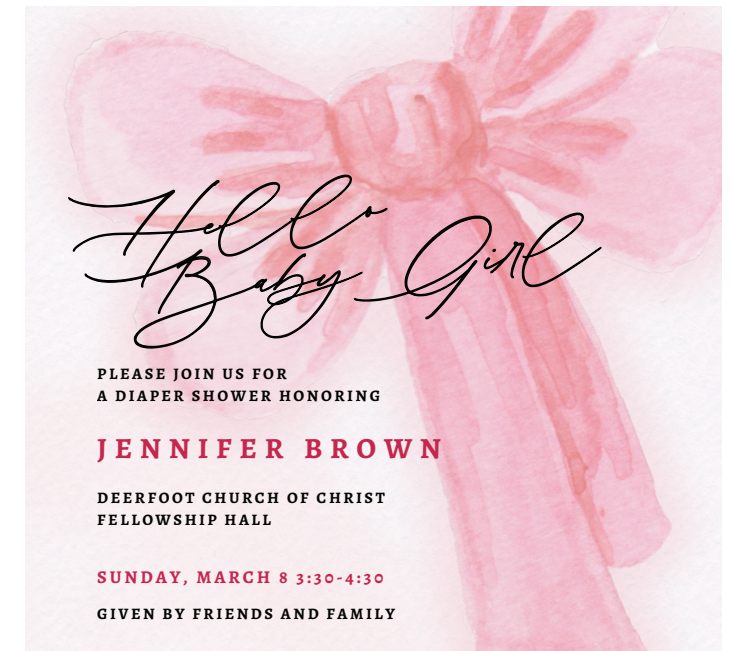
