From Caesar's Household to Scotland

When did Christianity arrive in the British Isles?

Legend – the apostle Andrew came to Scotland and built a church in Fife (Known as St Andrews the center for Evangelism) The Scottish Flag (where we got the Alabama flag) is the "St Andrews Cross." Tradition states that Andrew faced crucifixion and requested an X-shaped cross as he did not want to be crucified like his Lord.

Traditionally it was thought to be much later that Christianity arrived in the fifth and sixth centuries from Christian missionaries. However, two British Monks, Nennius and Geoffrey of Monmouth, provide a tantalizing glimpse of a much earlier scenario. Nennius lived in the ninth century and Geoffrey in the eleventh century. They left a fascinating record. In two Welsch poems known as Triads.

The Cambrian (Welsch) king Bran was seven years a hostage in Rome for his son Caradog. Caradog ruled the Britons for Rome, his father, being the guarantee of cooperation and good behavior according to standard Roman practice. The account goes that Bran and Caradog were marched in shackles before the Roman Senate to be executed by Nero. Caradog made a famous speech before the Senate to which he received a standing ovation. He also received his freedom. He was allowed to return home with a monthly stipend and to rule as a puppet king. His father Bran had to remain in Caesar's house as a hostage, and Guarantee, of Caradog's compliance in the British Isle.

The seven years that Bran was in Rome were from 51 to 58 AD. From the Epistle to the Romans, written by the Apostle Paul around 58 AD, it is evident that Christianity had a stronghold in the capital of the empire even in Caesar's household where Bran was a hostage.

"Greet every saint in Christ Jesus. The brothers who are with me greet you. 22 All the saints greet you, especially those of Caesar's household. 23 The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ be with your spirit" (Philippians 4:21–23).

When Bran was released from Caesar's household, in the year 58, he returned to Britain and it was he who "brought the faith of Christ to the Cambrians' (the Welsh Britons).

That Christianity came at all to Scotland, a small country on the edge of the world, is remarkable. That it came in a corrupt state is not so astonishing.

"Now the Spirit expressly says that in later times some will depart from the faith by devoting themselves to deceitful spirits and teachings of demons, 2 through the insincerity of liars whose consciences are seared, 3 who forbid marriage and require abstinence from foods that God created to be received with thanksgiving by those who believe and know the truth" (1 Timothy 4:1–3).

This happened in the British Isles and created the Dark Ages –

From approximately 600 to 1500 the British Isles were Roman Catholic. By 1000 AD the outlying Celtic Christian churches all but died out. After the Gospel arrived in Scotland, the Roman system of Christianity held sway for almost a thousand years.

It was overthrown by what is called 'the Reformation.' It transformed Scotland in the first half of the sixteenth century. Two hundred years before that, in 1314, Scotland's political freedom had been secured by Robert the Bruce and a valiant generation of Scots on the field of Bannockburn near Stirling. This allowed Scottish subjects the opportunity to make their own path toward religious freedom. A path of restoration.

Graham McDonald is a restoration preacher we support in Cumbernauld, Scotland. He must remain preaching in his native land. Assuming the accuracy of the legend, I am sure the ancient Welsch King Bran would be thankful to know there are still missionaries in his homeland, trying to bring the Gospel he learned in Caesar's household.


