Not By Design

You don't need to look far to find design in this world. Astounding designs are found within nature, like the microscopic mechanisms of living cells which run with more precision than any man-made machine. Inventive designs are also found in man-made creations like computers and electronic devices. Now when it comes to such human creations, what do we do with man-made things that don't function as they are designed to? If it doesn't cost us too much, we will usually get them fixed. But if it costs us too much time or money, we will often throw it away and replace it with a new one. This makes perfect sense. Why would we keep something that doesn't function as it was designed to – especially if fixing it would cost too much? We wouldn't. We don't. The truth is, anything that loses its design and function loses its reason to exist.

Now consider humanity: we were all made in the image and likeness of God, and we were all designed to live uprightly like our Creator (Gen. 1:26-27; Ecc. 7:29). And yet, all humans at some point abandoned the design and function for which they were made, and consequently, lost their reason to exist. And God would have been more than justified and right to eliminate something that no longer served the function for which He made it – as we often do ourselves when the things we make break (Rom. 6:23). "Well," one may retort, "the right thing for God to have done with humanity was to fix them, not throw them away." Is this true? What if the price to fix something is far greater than the value of the thing itself? A car that's totaled can sometimes be fixed. But would you? Do you? Anything broken beyond reasonable cost and repair is almost always discarded without question. And the truth is that the price to redeem humanity back to His original design and purpose was great – greater than the value of all humanity combined.

Jesus, by whom God created everything and gave life to all humans, and is an eternal soul of infinite value, was given to redeem corrupted and dysfunctional humans who had willingly departed from their design and function. God and Jesus owed nothing to the creatures who forsook their own design. The price to fix them was greater than the value of the broken creatures themselves. Humanity deserved to be totaled like a car. And the obligation to fix them did not exist. So why did God and Jesus go above and beyond to fix a dysfunctional creation that deserved to be eliminated? Because the love of God and Jesus for humanity was so great, that they decided to value us far beyond our actual worth. The greatness of such love is beyond human comprehension (Eph. 3:18-19). To say that we are undeserving is insufficient. Words fail. Feelings fail. They have treated us far better than how we treat broken things.

So let us remember whose image we are made in. Let us remember what God designed us to be. And let us never forget the immeasurable love of God and Jesus, who looked on the brokenness of humans, and found a way to restore them back to their original design.
