What is Essential? by Jeffrey Howell

When it comes to car maintenance, I'm what you might call a minimalist. Every time I go and get a checkup on my car, I receive a list of various things that I can pay for to "improve" my vehicle's health. But as we all know, automobile shops always offer extra "improvement" expenditures for car maintenance in hope getting more of your money. However, I – and not doubt many others – only opt for what is essential. I don't care about the extras. Unlike me, some people prefer the extras and don't mind spending more for those. But whether one is a minimalist or a maximalist when it comes to car maintenance, everyone can agree that the parts that are essential to a car's function are the most important.

Similarly, when it comes to commandments from the Bible, what is essential? I've seen Mat. 22:37-40 being used as the answer to this question. Here Jesus points out the 1st and 2nd greatest commandments of the Old Law. It was then argued that since "Love the Lord" and "Love your neighbor" are the two greatest commandments according to Jesus, all the other commandments of the Bible are lesser. The following point was made that commandments like getting baptized, growing the fruit of the Spirit, and giving generously were lesser commandments. This thinking, however, is mistaken. The idea that these two greatest commandments of the Old Law are the two greatest commandments for Christians is simply incorrect. As Jesus stated Himself, these are the two greatest of the Law and the Prophets – not of the New Covenant or Testament. Although these two commandments are still to be followed by Christians under Jesus' authority, having faith in Jesus Christ is undoubtably the most essential command for people – if one is pressed to rank and compare. But is it even Biblical to think of some commandments as being more essential than others?

We do have pretty clear evidence that some commandments and doctrines can be considered more essential than others according to the Bible. Jesus considered some commandments greater than others (Mat. 22:37-40), and some commandments to be weightier than others (Mat. 23:23). Some commandments are called more essential than others in the New Testament (Acts 15:28-29; Rom. 2:18). While this concept is Biblical, one must be careful in what he considers essential. As a car engine may be more essential and have more value than a car battery, without both of these essential parts, you do not have a functioning car. So is true of many commandments in the New Testament. The command to believe in Jesus may be more essential than baptism, but both are considered essential to salvation. There is no salvation without belief (Mk. 16:16), and there is no salvation without baptism (John 3:5). Whether one is more essential than another, both are still essential. Eph. 4:4-6 outlines seven essential beliefs – including baptism, showing that the beliefs and commands that are essential cannot just be limited to two. But ultimately, anything that is tied to salvation in Scripture is certainly essential. And willful disobedience to any commandment of Christ is a sin that must be repented from to avoid condemnation and punishment (Heb. 10:26-29). So, while some commandments are more essential than others, all commandments of Jesus must be obeyed (Mat. 28:20). Christ is there to forgive and cleanse His people when they fall short (1 John 1:7-2:2), but no commandment of the New Testament is to be treated as extra or unessential. So, let us always strive to let God's Word alone define for us what is
