Day ONE

A lot has been said about yesterday, the 250th anniversary of the adoption of the Declaration of Independence. But what about today, 250 years ago? What was Day One like after that momentous occasion? I wonder if John Hancock and the other delegates slept well that night. It would be another seven years, until September 3, 1783, when the Treaty of Paris was signed, before the colonies officially secured their independence. In many ways, they had placed a target on their backs. John Hancock made the biggest, most legible bull's-eye with his bold, flowing signature!

Day One of a new beginning is never the completed story. Even God had not completed His creation on Day One. "In the beginning, God created the heavens and the earth. The earth was without form and void, and darkness was over the face of the deep. And the Spirit of God was hovering over the face of the waters. And God said, "Let there be light," and there was light. And God saw that the light was good. And God separated the light from the darkness. God called the light Day, and the darkness he called Night. And there was evening and there was morning, the first day" (Genesis 1:1-5). Day one saw light but mankind was only a glimmer in the Father's plan.

Day one for the Church also saw light! "And with many other words he bore witness and continued to exhort them, saying, "Save yourselves from this crooked generation." So those who received his word were baptized, and there were added that day about three thousand souls" (Acts 2:40-42).

The light of the Gospel entered into the world, but a target was already forming. "And as they were speaking to the people, the priests and the captain of the temple and the Sadducees came upon them, greatly annoyed because they were teaching the people and proclaiming in Jesus the resurrection from the dead. And they arrested them and put them in custody until the next day, for it was already evening. But many of those who had heard the word believed, and the number of the men came to about five thousand" (Acts 4:1-5).

Eventually, persecution intensified, culminating in the martyrdom of Stephen. "And Saul approved of his execution. And there arose on that day a great persecution against the church in Jerusalem, and they were all scattered throughout the regions of Judea and Samaria, except the apostles" (Acts 8:1). Yet God used that persecution to create another Day One. Soon Cornelius (Acts 10) and other Gentiles obeyed the gospel and entered the fold.

Is there someone in your life who you can influence to become a Christian? Someone who has yet to experience their Day One?
