The Heavens Declare the Glory of God

This year's theme for Camp Maywood—"The Heavens Declare the Glory of God"—feels especially fitting. Whether by divine design or happy coincidence, this very idea echoes one of the original purposes for youth camps in America.

Just down the road, Camp Cosby was founded 103 years ago, in 1922. It was part of a growing youth camp movement in the U.S., which began in the mid-1800s. These early camps were largely a response to rapid urbanization. As cities became crowded and industrial life intensified, reformers and educators grew concerned about the toll on young people's health and morality.

In 1938, Congress passed the Fair Labor Standards Act, which limited child labor for the first time. Before that, many children worked full days in factories or fields. Camps became a way to offer something different—rest, nature, purpose, and a chance to breathe.

As Psalm 19:1–3 says:
"The heavens declare the glory of God, and the sky above proclaims his handiwork.
Day to day pours out speech, and night to night reveals knowledge.
There is no speech, nor are there words, whose voice is not heard."

My first summer at Maywood was 33 years ago, during Dale Jenkins' week—back when he was preaching in Hamilton. I still remember telling Dale I was in the second grade that year. Let's just say... at least I got a good laugh out of it.

Of course, camp today doesn't look quite like it did back then—and even then, we weren't camping in tents! Still, the same spirit remains. We all come to witness "the tent for the sun" (Psalm 19:4), and to be surrounded by creation that proclaims the handiwork of God.

For six days, our children step away from screens, game systems, and phones. Today's kids may not be laboring in factories, but technology competes for every moment of their attention. Camp gives them space to look up—perhaps for the first time in a while. Because here's the truth: The heavens declare the glory of God—but you have to look up to see it. Too many miss the message because their heads are down. But creation still proclaims: "There IS a God, and He IS alive!"

Paul put it this way in Romans 1:20:
"For His invisible attributes, namely, His eternal power and divine nature, have been clearly perceived, ever since the creation of the world, in the things that have been made. So they are without excuse."

So, send your children—and your grandchildren—to camp.
Let them look up before they grow up.

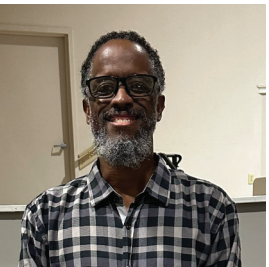
