Be That One

The first time I remember hearing the phrase, "See a need, fill a need," was from John Gallagher. It is a simple phrase, yet it is incredibly helpful in carrying out the work of the Lord.

I was reminded of that phrase on Friday as we remembered the events of September 11, twenty-five years later. When everyone else was running away from the fire, there were men and women running into it.

We could say that it was the professionals who saw the need and filled the need. Yet I heard several stories this week that I had never heard before. Stories from that fateful Tuesday in September about ordinary people who became extraordinary heroes.

Charles "Chuck" Costello Jr. was an elevator mechanic who ran more than two miles toward the World Trade Center to help free people trapped in elevators. He knew how to manually override the elevator system and used his knowledge to help rescue hundreds of people trapped in the towers.

Jan Demczur was a Polish window washer who was running to catch an elevator in the North Tower just minutes before the first plane struck. He used the extension handle from his squeegee to trip the elevator door's safety mechanism and force it to open. He would become the sixth man on that elevator apologizing for delaying their ascent. The six men would become trapped near the 50th floor. Jan used his squeegee to break through layers of drywall along the elevator shaft, eventually freeing all six men. I don't think he needed to apologize to them for forcing his way onto their elevator. Without that handle, he would not have gotten onto the elevator. Without that squeegee, they would have perished.

Seeing a need and filling that need can be a heroic strategy. Jesus tells a similar story in the parable of the Good Samaritan in Luke 10:30-37. A Jewish traveler was beaten, robbed, and left for dead. Two men, a priest and a Levite, came near him. They saw the need. But they passed by on the other side. Then came a Samaritan.

"But a Samaritan, as he journeyed, came to where he was, and when he saw him, he had compassion. He went to him and bound up his wounds, pouring on oil and wine. Then he set him on his own animal and brought him to an inn and took care of him" (Luke 10:33-34).

The Samaritan was simply a man who saw a need and filled the need.

He was not the person Jesus' audience would have anticipated to become the hero of the story. Yet he did what needed to be done. He used what he had, gave what he could, and went where he was needed. Sometimes the right person for the job is simply the person willing to do the job.

"Which of these three, do you think, proved to be a neighbor to the man who fell among the robbers?" He said, "The one who showed him mercy." And Jesus said to him, "You go, and do likewise" (Luke 10:36-37). Jesus is telling us all to see a need and fill a need. The priest saw the need. The Levite saw the need. The Samaritan saw the need. Only one did something about it. Be that one.
