The Day of Salvation

There are certain special days that continue to live on in our memories – family gatherings, weddings, birthdays, graduations, etc. We will cherish these moments in our hearts as long as our memories last. And as monumental as these moments are in our lives, do they really compare to when we were saved? Salvation is described in the Bible as going from death to life (John 5:24). And so, it cannot be overemphasized: there is nothing more important to remember than when we were saved. But many people who consider themselves to be saved can't think of a day or a moment in which they were saved. Such people point to a phase in their lives where they think they became saved – but not a specific moment. Some people do point to a specific moment of spiritual conviction or a dramatic life event in which they consider themselves to have become saved. This leads to the question, is there a day and a moment in which one becomes saved? What do people remember about their salvation if they were in fact saved?

In Acts 2, we see what the first converts to Christianity experienced regarding their salvation. Peter instructed them to repent and be baptized for the forgiveness of their sins (Acts 2:38). He continued to plead with them to obey these instructions, saying "Be saved..." (Acts 2:40). Those who obeyed Peter's instructions to become saved were baptized. And those who were baptized were added (Acts 2:41). And those who were added by being baptized were saved (Acts 2:47). For these first Christian converts, salvation was clear: it was the moment that they were baptized that they were saved and added to God's people.

And God's Word affirms baptism as the point of salvation again and again. Take for example Paul's conversion. After seeing Jesus in vision, fasting for three days (Acts 9:9), praying (Acts 9:11), and then miraculously being healed of his blindness (Acts 22:13), Paul still did not consider himself to have been saved. Recalling his own conversion, Paul remembered that after all of these experiences, he still had to wash away his sins in baptism (Acts 22:16). And that is precisely what he did (Acts 9:18). Paul remembered the day and the moment of his salvation. It wasn't a phase. It wasn't even a spiritual vision or a miraculous experience. It was the moment that he was baptized (Acts 22:16). Likewise, Paul also reminded the Romans (Rom. 6:3-7), the Galatians (Gal. 3:26-27), and the Corinthians (1 Cor. 6:11) that the moment they were baptized was the moment that they were saved.

According to God's Word, those who have been saved know the day and the moment of their salvation was at their baptism. Anyone who is not pointing back to their baptism as the moment of their salvation is yet to follow God's Word. So, let us strive to help people see that salvation does have a clear day and a moment according to God's Word. And let us who do remember the day and the moment of our salvation never forget it (2 Pet. 1:9).
